Please note the following about the awards:

1. Councils will be placed in each Division based on their membership as of July 1, 2015.
2. Only councils not under suspension as of June 30, 2015 by the Supreme Council or the PA State Council are eligible.
3. There will be only one (1) winner per division. Total of twelve (12) membership awards.
4. Ties will be broken in the following manner:
 - a. The least number of suspensions recorded for this fraternal year.
 - b. The following forms must be recorded as “received” at Supreme Council; Form 185, 1728 and SP7.
 - c. All Semi-Annual Audits must be submitted to the Supreme Council when due.
 - d. Total Membership in council, as of July 1, 2015. (Lowest number of members first)
5. Final standings will be based on the Membership Status Report as of June 30, 2015.

Roundtables

The Parish Roundtable Program is the best way to establish your council's presence in each parish your council serves. **This year, the Jurisdiction of Pennsylvania has exceeded its goal for Roundtable formation – our goal was 75 Roundtables and to date, Pennsylvania has 76 reported Roundtables.**

Every council that serves two (2) or more parishes should establish a Roundtable at each parish. Pastors of the parishes should be contacted before the Roundtable is formed. Roundtables are not separate councils, but work within a council for a particular parish. Roundtable Coordinators for each parish should meet regularly with the Pastor to determine how the Knights can assist in the parish.

To establish a Roundtable a council must first file Form 2629 (Report of the Roundtable Coordinator) with the Supreme Council. After filing the form the council must work with the Pastor of the parish and offer assistance wherever needed.

At the close of each fraternal year the council must file Form 2630 (Annual Report of the K of C Round Table) with the Supreme Council noting the activities the council participated in with the parish. EACH YEAR THE COUNCIL MUST RESUBMIT FORM 2629. If the form is not refilled the Supreme Council considers the Roundtable dissolved.
