40 Cans for 40 Days Project will kick off again

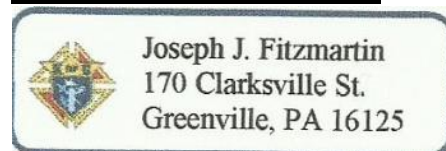
