Chaplain's Message.....

MAKE YOUR LENT MEANINGFUL —

Dear Brother Knights,

It's hard to believe that we have just entered the season of Lent. How can we make this six week retreat of the Church more meaningful? Pope Francis in his Lenten message; "**The Word is a gift.**

Other persons are a gift," which offers us some assistance in answering that question by directing our attention to the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. In this story we find inspiration, for it provides a key to understanding what we need to do in order to attain true happiness and eternal life.

Pope Francis points out that as Lazarus lies before the rich man's door, he is described in great detail. "This character is not anonymous. His features are clearly delineated and he appears as an individual with his own story."

Pope Francis reminds us that, "Each of us meets people like this every day. Each life we encounter is a gift, deserving acceptance, respect and love. The word of God helps us to open our eyes to welcome and love life, especially when it is weak and vulnerable."

In order for us to do this, Pope Francis said that we must look more deeply at the rich man. His life was of wealth, greed and vanity. Instead of using his money for good, he was an example of how "money can chain us and the entire world to a selfish logic that leaves no room for love and hinders peace." The pope goes on to say "The result of attachment to money is a sort of blindness. The rich man doesn't see the poor man who is starving, hurting, lying at his door." The consequences of these choices are severe. The rich man ends up suffering in the afterlife – unable to warn his loved ones who are still living of the consequences of their selfish choices. "When we close our heart to the gift of God's word, then we end up closing our heart to the gift of our brothers and sisters.

With me, I hope you will find Pope Francis' reflection one of encouragement and inspiration. Our lives do have a real purpose, and that's not to acquire things, but to care for people. If you ask me, this is a great way to begin the universal six week retreat of the season of Lent, a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. May the Lord be praised in ALL that we do. Blessings...
