Chaplain's Message.....

We Can All Make a Difference

Dear Brother Knights,

As baptized Christians, our constant mission is to build the Church. This has nothing to do with buildings and



everything to do with a community of believers. We also know that the best way to make disciples for Jesus is to become better disciples of Jesus. Are you active in growing the Church? Here are a few suggestions to consider that can contribute to the good of every parish:

- 1. First: Do all that you can to become a more welcoming member of your community. Feedback from and statistics of those who join a church will tell you that the number one factor that influences their decision to join (or leave) a community is experiencing a sense of welcome. Ask yourself why you go back to certain restaurants or businesses? It's not just about the food, but the service. Hospitality is not just the work of a few who wear name tags and serve as "official greeters". It's the responsibility of everyone in the parish. It's not hard; treat everyone at church as you would a guest in your home. Pay special attention to strangers or new comers. This is how you can help build a welcoming community.
- 2. Second: Sing. Unfortunately, we as Catholics do not enjoy a good reputation for singing in church. (If you don't believe me, visit a Protestant church.) You don't have to sing well, just sing like you mean it! Worship involves action! Anything less is just observation which is not what disciples of Jesus do. Can you imagine what our worship would feel like if everyone (beginning with you) sang openly?
- 3. Third: Everyone needs to practice responsible stewardship. Responsible stewardship involves knowing what percentage of weekly, monthly, or annual income you return to God through charitable giving? We know what the Lord asks of us 10% the tithe. Not bad when you appreciate that God allows us to use 90% of our income for our own responsible purpose. How close are you to meeting that expectation? Do the math and identify the actual proportion your gift in comparison to your income. Consider increasing your gift just 1% each year until you reach the goal. This is the only fair way of giving that it makes a sacrificial gift equal to everyone no excuses.

As the baptized and as Knights, we are called to lead. Pray. See the difference your openness, faith, and growing love of Jesus makes in your community.

In addition, our Knights plan on attending the Bishop's Appreciation Dinner.

Finally, as described in detail in the Olive Branch, our Council has instituted a program of regular support to charities including the sponsorship of Tuition Scholarships benefiting two students in each one of our four parishes.
