Chaplain's Message.....

Living Lent,
Learning From Nature

Dear Brother Knights,

When you think of the season of spring, what images come to mind? Looking-out my office window, I'm anticipating the foliage that will soon be filling-out the barren trees and shrubs. Similarly, the lifeless lawn will be greening-up. Bulbs planted years ago will be sending forth leaves from the earth that will be blooming (provided the deer are kind enough to ignore). They will also multiply each year as the trees continue to grow taller and taller. Spring is all about growth and there's no going back! Trees don't grow smaller and neither do the bulbs dwindle.

The word "Lent" actually-means spring. Lent is a time of new life and growth - a great time to access our growth as disciples of Jesus. I sometimes chuckle when people tell me what exercise they embark on as part of their Lenten discipline. It's not uncommon to hear adults say, "I've given-up chocolate" or "I'm not drinking coffee for Lent." Giving-up chocolate may be great if you're a kid in school. And as for giving-up coffee, I can only think of agitated people that only irritate others around them as-a-result of their caffeine withdrawal. It's not pretty!

Lent is to be about growing as a disciple of the Lord, and I'm not sure if abstaining from chocolate or caffeine are the most effective ways to do that as for us as adults. A better path may be to foster a deeper prayer life by taking the time to read the Gospels daily or make time to sit in church with Jesus during the week. Pray the Stations of the Cross weekly at your parish. Consider disciplines like stop complaining about everything or anything or give something away each day. How about doing an intentional act of love each day; or stop the annoying habit of interrupting others. There are so many ways we can meaningfully grow as disciples. And like the trees that grow larger and the bulbs that multiply, there should be no going back.

Every parish priest experiences a certain sadness on Easter Monday every year when the number of people attending weekday Mass dwindles to pre-Lenten numbers. Why? The celebration of Easter has just begun. Why not continue to make the celebration of the Eucharist a part your daily routine? Lent is time to make us better, holier, happier people! Make Lent meaningful and continue to stay close to the Lord throughout the Easter season and beyond. There's more to Lent than just 40 days. Like all of life, Lent is a time of preparation for heaven....

February 14th 2018 was Ash Wednesday, which marked the commencement of the forty-day liturgical season of traditional Lenten practices including special prayers, fasting, and almsgiving. During this period, we should make a special effort to examine the status of our spiritual lives and participate in the devotions offered during this time such as the Stations of the Cross. On February 16th 2018 the Stations of the Cross were prayed for the first time in the new St. Alexis church. Bishop Zubik led the devotion. He commented that he had been touched by the fact that the statues used in the stations in the new church were originally installed in what was then St. Stanislaus Church in Ambridge. He recalled first seeing the stations when he was a young boy attending Mass with his parents.

Since my last Message, many activities have taken place, beginning with the Annual March-for-Life in Washington DC on Friday January 19th 2018. Many Knights attended this most visible sign of our support for the Pro-Life Movement.

Although the Men's Retreats at St. Paul of the Cross Monastery are not a Knights' of Columbus function, many of our members attend and benefit from the weekend retreats held annually by the Passionists. Many members from each of the parishes affiliated with our council attend one of the retreats presented by the priests at the Monastery. I encourage you to attend one of these retreats when you are able.

Our regular events continue as follows:

- First Friday Overnight Eucharistic Adoration. The most recent adoration took place on February 2nd-3rd 2018 in the Grotto Chapel of Saints John & Paul. The next adoration will be on Friday, March 2nd-3rd 2018.
- On March 1st 2018 our next Retired Priests Luncheon will be held at Vincentian Home. Bob Shaffrey and Morrie Stack organize this event.

(NEW DRESS-CODE) All candidates must dress in a dark suit (black, dark grey, or navy blue), white dress shirt, tie, black socks and black shoes. Details provided within application. Clergy and Servicemen who are candidates or members may attend in the formal dress uniform of their respective service.

Your Lady's attendance is requested. An optional morning Mass is offered prior to the degree. There will be a Ladies program provided during the degree.
