Brothers,

The year is flying by! In a short time, my term as Grand Knight will be over and new officers will be in place. I have enjoyed the experience of serving the Council and have learned a great deal. My fellow Knights have provided significant support that has benefitted me greatly. Without that help it would have been impossible for me to fulfill my duties as Grand Knight. To each member of the Council, I offer my prayers of Thanksgiving.

During my tenure a major change has taken place. With the help of my brother Knights we relocated our Council home from the Swinderman Road location that we occupied for so many years to our current Council home in the Wexford Professional Building II on Perry Highway. We just marked the first anniversary of our move with a surprise cake supplied by DGK Bill Romig and his wife Rita. In addition, the Church is re-organizing and re-aligning our parishes including the assignment of our priests. By the time this message is published, Bishop Zubik will have made the official announcement.

The year is not over and many events are planned including the following:

- On Thursday April 19th, the Fifty-Eighth Pittsburgh Bishop's Project Appreciation Dinner, hosted by St. Joseph the Worker Council #5947 took place at The Club at Shadow Lakes in Aliquippa. Under the leadership of Steve Seaman, Council #3907 raised \$11,000 this year which is its highest annual total ever. In the Project's 59-year history \$259,591.40 has been raised by our Council.
- On Saturday April 21st, the 12th Annual Gathering of Catholic Men took place at Cardinal Wuerl North Catholic High School.
- On April 22nd, our Family Mass was celebrated at 11:00am at St. Alexis followed by Lunch at the Walnut Grill.
- Four times a year the Knights host a Priest's Luncheon for residents of Vincentian Home. Knight Bob Shaffrey organizes these quarterly luncheons where the Knights serve the residents and help transport them from their rooms to the area where the luncheon is served. On Tuesday April 24th the Vincentian Collaborative System invited volunteers including the Knights of Columbus to the Annual Appreciation Luncheon at the Martina Spiritual Renewal Center. Bob Shaffrey, Mike Conroy, George Franz, and Bill McKim attended for the Knights.
- On Saturday May 12th, Council #3907 will present: "**A Nite at the Races**" in Bovard Hall at St. John Neumann Church. See the Olive Branch for further details.
- Finally, the 120th Annual State Convention of the PA Knights of Columbus will take place in Harrisburg PA on May 4-6th 2018. Seven members of Council #3907 have prepared or helped with the preparation of materials to be submitted for consideration for a State Program Award or a Supreme Council Award.

The Pitfalls of Replacing Coverage

You know the old saying, "the grass seems greener on the other side of the fence", but we all know that it rarely is. The same holds true when it comes to replacing your existing Knights of Columbus life insurance with coverage offered by another company. Perceptions are deceiving. A move to the "greener" grass on the other side of the fence might seem like a good one, but it can leave you with less green in your wallet — in some cases, a lot less. That's why it pays to remember another old-adage, "Read the fine print".

There are many reasons to keep your existing coverage in force, whether that coverage is with the Knights of Columbus or with another company. I'll focus on the potential pitfalls of replacing coverage here — pitfalls that an agent trying to convince you that the grass actually-is greener might neglect to mention.

First, all life insurance contracts contain a *contestability period*, which allows the insurer to contest claims made for a period — typically two years — after the contract is issued. Chances are this is no longer an issue with your current coverage.

Second, it's unlikely that you can obtain the same amount of coverage, for the same premium, that you were able to obtain with your existing contract. The two factors that determine how much you'll need to pay for life insurance coverage are age and health. Certainly, you're older now than you were when you took out your current coverage. There's no way around that. And you have-to ask yourself, has your health changed during that time? Is your blood pressure the same? Your cholesterol? Have you gained weight? All these factors can affect the amount of coverage you'll get for your premium dollar.

If someone encourages you to replace — or worse, drop — your existing coverage, please call me. I'll show you how your existing coverage is working for you and why replacement is rarely in your best interest....

Upcoming Council Elections

COUNCIL OFFICERS

Chapter XIV, Section 128, of the "Charter Constitution Laws of the Knights of Columbus states that" All officers, except the Financial Secretary, Lecturer and Chaplain, shall be elected annually, by ballot, at a regular business meeting held between the fifteenth of May, to and including the fifteenth day of June each year." — The duties of the officers are: **Chapter XV...**

GRAND KNIGHT (Sec. 135): Preside over all meetings and shall enforce the rules and regulations of the council and the Laws of the Order and shall be chairman of the Board of Trustees. Appoint all committees and be the Chairman ex-officio of all committees. Act as Chaplain in the absence of the regular Chaplain, countersign all vouchers and orders as drawn by the Financial Secretary and sign all checks written by the Treasurer. Read all vouchers and receipts as prepared by the Financial Secretary.

Read all notices of the 4th Degree as sent to him by the Supreme Council, Supreme Master, Vice-Supreme Master and Master of the 4th Degree.

He shall also authorize the use of the "Phone Tree" in case of the death of members and other emergencies.

DEPUTY GRAND KNIGHT (Sec. 136): Shall preside in the absence of, or inability of the Grand Knight to execute the duties of said Grand Knight. He shall perform such duties as the Order may impose. In Council #3907 the Deputy Grand Knight usually also serves as the General Program Chairman, and appoints all committee chairmen, subject to the approval of the Grand Knight.

He shall perform such other duties as the Order may impose. As Deputy Grand Knight of Our Lady of Olives Council #3907, he also serves as President of Columbian Knights #3907 Inc. and is Chairman of the Governing Board of the same.

CHANCELLOR (Sec. 137): The Chancellor shall assist the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight in the performance of their duties and shall take charge of the council in their absence,

He shall exercise a special interest in new members and those members who are sick or in distress, including phone contact and sending of greeting cards.

RECORDER (Sec. 138): The Recorder shall keep a true record of the doings of his council upon books approved by the Board of Directors and furnished by the Supreme Secretary at the expense of the council; conduct all correspondence of the council and perform such duties as the council Order may direct. He shall serve as the Secretary of Columbian Knights #3907, Inc.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY (Sec. 139): Shall collect and receive all moneys due the council, and all funds obtained from any source in the name of the council. He shall keep an account of the indebtedness of each member and be responsible for the proper billing of the membership. He shall pay to the Treasurer all moneys received from all sources for which said Treasurer will give a written receipt for the same. He shall keep a roll of all members including all pertinent data on the member. He shall cause all members to subscribe to the Laws and Rules of the Order. He shall notify the Supreme Council of the names and addresses of all council officers. He shall keep a record of the financial business transactions of his council upon books as approved by the Supreme Board of Directors. He shall draw orders on the Treasurer when ordered by Supreme Council, State Council, Local council, Board of Trustees, or Grand

Knight for the payment of all claims or demands against his council, which orders shall be signed by him and countersigned by the Grand Knight. He shall promptly notify the Supreme Secretary of the names of members initiated, suspended, expelled, withdrawn, deceased, reinstated, readmitted, transferred into or out of the council, and all changes of address for necessary entry on the Supreme Council records. He shall be the accountant of his council, keeping accurate records of the financial status of his council as required by the Supreme Council. He shall keep the seal of his council and affix the same to all proper papers. He shall notify the Comptroller of the 4th Degree of any member who shall transfer to another councilor may be suspended by the council.

TREASURER (Sec. 140): Shall be the custodian of all funds of the council obtained from any source. He shall receive all funds from the Financial Secretary and issue the Financial Secretary a receipt for the same. He shall deposit all funds in an account as approved by the Grand Knight and Trustees. He shall pay to the State or Supreme Secretary all assessments as issued by them in a timely manner. All orders shall be paid by check, money order or draft signed by the Treasurer and countersigned by the Grand Knight. He shall keep separate accounts of moneys placed in his hands and shall show records of each separate account. He shall retain all orders of the Grand Knight as his vouchers. He shall also serve as Treasurer of Columbian Knights #3907, Inc.

LECTURER (Sec. 141): Shall endeavor to entertain his council at meetings and perform such duties as his council may direct, including repast after meetings.

ADVOCATE (Sec. 142): Shall be the attorney of the council in case of trial and investigation of any matter whatsoever of interest to the council.

WARDEN (Sec. 143): Shall be in-charge of all physical properties of the council: he shall be responsible for the proper arrangements of the council for meetings, etc. Shall instruct guards of their duties and shall carry out other duties as may be imposed by his council.

GUARDS (Sec. 144): Shall act as guards for the inner and outer doors of the council and assist the Warden and perform other such duties as imposed by the council.

TRUSTEES (Sec. 145): Shall be elected to three-year terms on a staggered basis. Shall oversee the financial operations of the council; be responsible for the semi-annual audits of their council. They shall also serve as Directors of Columbian Knights #3907, Inc. and the Board of Governors of the same.

CHAPLAIN (Sec. 33): The chaplain shall be responsible for all religious activities of the council. He shall be selected by the Grand Knight and Trustees, subject to the approval of the Diocesan Bishop if required. Shall be responsible for the spiritual wellbeing of the membership and act as spiritual advisor to the Grand Knight.

Grand Knight, Bill McKim, has appointed our Trustees: Ed Thomas (412-980-7973), Joe Mancuso (412-443-5840), and Chuck Mazur (412-366-2351), to serve as the nominating committee. Nominations will be made at the meetings of May 2nd & May 16th, final nominations and elections will be held on June 6th 2018. Those elected will take office on July 1st 2018. If you are interested in serving your council or would like to nominate a brother knight for office, contact any of the three Trustees listed above.
