Fifth Sunday Rosary Service January 29th:



In the <u>Kindergarten</u> thru Second grade division with 34 entries, the winners


were: First Place Emma Loreno grade 2, Second Place Bailey Murray grade 2; Third Place Grace Wingard grade 2.
