Chaplain's Message.....

Dear Brother Knights,

It's "back to school" time. Advertisements for back to school supplies have been running in the papers since early July, and now there is what seems to be a constant run of commercials on television for back to school clothing. Have you noticed the increase of school buses on the road? It's time to train new bus drivers and review the old routes. This theme of back to school is nothing new for us as Christians; in fact, it's a part of our identity as disciples of Jesus. Are we not all students of Jesus?



There are many titles and descriptions of Jesus found in Scripture. He is Lord, Savior, Master and Redeemer. And yet, of the 90 times that Jesus was addressed directly in the Gospels, in 60 of those times he was called "Teacher." Followers of Jesus referred to him as "Teacher" countless times. In fact, Jesus described himself as a teacher: "You call me 'teacher' and 'master,' and rightly so, for indeed I am" (John 13:13)

Just think, Jesus never entered a classroom. He never held a degree. And yet, the whole world was his classroom and it continues to be. Without question, Jesus is the greatest teacher of all time! Jesus' final words and ultimate command to his disciples before ascending into the heavens was simple and clear: "Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19)

When you stop and think about it, there is never an end to our studies and we are always in school. Based on Jesus' ultimate command, what grade would you assign yourself? What grade do you think the Teacher – Jesus, would give you in following his teachings? Examinations (of conscious) are not bad; in fact, they're very helpful in directing us to refocus our thoughts and lives. More importantly, trust the Teacher, who provides all the supplies we need to accomplish what he asks of us. Besides, He has promised to be with us always, until the end of the age. Back to school? We've never left the 'classroom!' Share in The Teacher's joy!

On August 11th 2017, we lost a beloved and most highly regarded brother of our council, George A. Ley, Jr. He was 92. George held many leadership positions in our council including that of Grand Knight and Financial Secretary. He was our last surviving Charter Member. He was a member of the Gold Tie Club, an organization unique to Our Lady of Olives Council. The Club was formed in 1965 to recognize individual members of the Council for their unselfish contributions to the Council, the Order and our Church. George was inducted into the Club in 1967. He was an active member of St. Alexis Parish. He was a member of the Serra Club, an organization that supports our priests. George was active in many community organizations including his service as a Volunteer Fireman. He lent his musical talent to Barber Shop groups. He is survived by Gloria, his loving wife of 69 years, five children, six grandchildren and seven great grandchildren. George was a graduate of MIT and served in the Navy V12 Program during WWII. He had a distinguished career as a Mechanical Engineer and a business founder and owner. George's fellow Knights, including the Color Corps, with family and friends gathered on Tuesday evening, August 15th, at George A. Thoma Funeral Home to recite the Rosary in George's memory. The next day a Mass was offered at St. Alexis Church followed by a military ceremony in which the Navy thanked Gloria for George's service and presented her with a United States Flag. We will miss George and will remember him in our prayers.

**SK George Andrew Ley, Jr.,
PGK FFS
1/3/1925 > 8/11/2017**

On August 11th, we lost our last remaining "Charter Member" of Our Lady of Olives Council #3907.

Our good friend, George Ley took his 1st Degree on Nov. 1st 1954 in one of the formation classes for our new Council being formed at St. Alphonsus Church in Wexford.

State Secretary, Thomas P. Conroy and District Deputy Jake Sopko were the key figures in the formation at the request of Rev. Ferdinand Angel, Pastor of St. Alphonsus.

George immediately became active in the council, whether it be stoking the fire in the old pot belly stove before meetings or as a member of the new council's First-Degree Team.

George was a 1943 graduate of Central Catholic HS and a 1946 graduate of MIT (Massachusetts Institute of Technology) where he majored in Mechanical Engineering,

He then went on to serve in the U.S. Navy during the later stages of World War II in the V-12 Program.

His love for music, especially singing led to his formation of the #3907 Choir, singing at Degrees and other Council functions.

He was an active member of the St. Alphonsus Choir and later in the new St. Alexis Parish Choir.

He further advanced his singing with the Butler Notables, Barber Shop quartet and the Cranberry Bogmeisters.

George and his wife of over 69-years, Gloria (Harold) Ley, were very involved with the Pittsburgh Opera and the St. Lucy Guild for the Blind.

For over 60-years he was the DGK of the 1st Degree Team, conferring the 1st Degree on more new members than anyone else in the history of Pennsylvania.

When the new 2nd Degree was instituted in 1981, it was George who implemented the "Welcoming Explanation" after the Degree explaining the real principles of the Degree. Many new members stated that they got more out of the 3-5 minutes from the District Deputy, Grand Knight, and George than the degree itself.

George served our Council as Grand Knight from 1992 to 1994 then as Financial Secretary from 1995 through 2012.

He was also the long-time President of our Gold Tie Club.

He was selected as the recipient of the prestigious James J. Palmer Award by the Pittsburgh Chapter in 2009.

He was a Sir Knight of the 4th Degree in the Fort Pitt Assembly until becoming a Charter Member of the Queen of Angels Assembly #2191 in 1989.

George was also a long-time member of the Serra Club of Pittsburgh, fostering vocations for the Diocese. He became a member in 1966 and was elected President in 1971.

As a founding partner in the Olson-Ley Mechanical Contracting firm, George was involved in the design and building of many mechanical systems throughout the Tri-State area.

And he still found time to design (and oversee the installation) of the mechanical systems for the Knights of Columbus home on Swinderman Road.
